Student must be a declared MSU mathematics or mathematics education major who is eligible* to take Calculus I or higher. Preference will be given to a student with a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA.

*With a score of 27 or higher on the ACT mathematics portion (or 620 or higher on the SAT math portion), or transferable college credit in pre-calculus/trigonometry/calculus, or an approved score on the departmental placement test to be administered during SOAR.
